## | EDITORIAL | God's Vision for our Lives

**M**any of us will come to a point in our lives where we ask three very important questions:

- 1) Who am I?

**BL** :: *Please summarize the "5Fs" and what our church can look like once we've truly embraced them as God's vision for our lives?*

First, Jesus taught me to know and love Father God. This is my worship to Him as Creator and this focus is called **FAITH**. God then taught me how to love and be with other people; first, those closest to me, **FAMILY** and then those around me, through **FELLOWSHIP**. Part of this connecting with people is the next focus, **FORTIFIER**, which involves learning and sharing the Word to help others grow to spiritual maturity (discipleship) and then living it out through acts of service. Finally, in the focus of **FRONTIER**, as a Christian, I am encouraged to go out and tell others about Who God is and what He has done in my life. 💡

## Put on the Full Armour of God!

The Bible depicts countless battles. From Genesis to Revelation, its pages reveal there are both physical and spiritual wars raging. However, the primary focus of Scripture is the ongoing conflict between Christ and Satan. In this showdown between the forces of good and the powers of evil, truth and light are under constant attack from deception and darkness. And like it or not, every single one of us is involved. The battleground for this intense spiritual struggle is not some piece of earthly real estate; it is the human heart, whom both Jesus and the devil are supremely interested in winning possession of.


For this reason, Christians are called to be more than peaceful spectators or mediators in this cataclysmic conflict. We must be committed front-line commandos. God has designed that all the literal battles recorded in the Bible—from Gideon’s conflict with the Midianites to David’s defeat of Goliath—serve to teach us how we might experience victory in spiritual combat. Naturally, it should stand to reason that because these battles are of a spiritual nature, the weapons we employ must also be spiritual. This is why Paul reminds us, “We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places” (Ephesians 6:12).

Although our armour and weapons are spiritual, this does not mean they are unreal or ineffective. “For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh: (For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds)” (2 Corinthians 10:3, 4).

The first time I did a study on the armour of God, I looked up all the Bible references to armour, searching for passages that would support and enhance the importance of wearing armour when charging off into battle. I was a bit disappointed to find that Saul’s armour did not fit David and that Goliath’s armour was useless against David’s stone. I also discovered that a stray arrow found a crack in Ahab’s armour, killing the wicked king. “So much for the value of armour!” I thought. But then I realized that we are not called to wear the faulty body armour of Saul, Ahab, or Goliath. Rather, we must put on the unfailing armour of God!

Now that we have established that we are to wear the armour of God and not of man, we must be careful not to miss the admonition to wear *all* of the articles God provides. Ephesians 6:11 cautions, “Put on the whole armour of God,” and Ephesians 6:13 declares, “Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God.” This is where many Christians fail. They take some of the armour, but forget one or two parts of the suit—and pay an eternal price for their neglect. Let’s consider each of these articles of defense one by one to see what we can learn. 💡

# | FAITH | SIMPLY TO LOVE YOU

First, whilst studying the Bible, I came to know how I was brought into existence on this earth. As I read through Scripture, it was clear to me that I am not a creator. Rather, I am a creature that God has created. When I know that God is the Creator, then I can worship only Him. This is where the first of the “5Fs” comes in: FAITH.

Faith is about Who I worship. God created me to love Him. My first priority in life is to know and to love God the Creator. Jesus said, “Love God with all your heart.” It is about me fully surrendering to God. How do I know if I really know and love Him? There is a warning light that flashes in my life whenever I am disconnected from God. God thought you up in His mind and created you simply to love you; because God is love. He didn’t need you. God wasn’t lonely. God’s never been lonely. But He wanted you, and the number one reason you were made was simply to love you.

If you ever grasp the profound truth I just shared with you and you let it sink into your psyche and into your heart, you will never again have a problem with inferiority or insecurity or low self-esteem. God created the entire universe just so He could create the conditions for human beings to exist in order for Him to create you and love you. That’s how much you matter to God. That’s how

Scott Griswold, former Director of the Global Mission Study Center for Buddhism located in Thailand, spoke during our divine service on January 12, 2013. He shared how God’s work is spreading everywhere, even penetrating non-Christian countries under very difficult circumstances.

“Buddhists,” he said “do not believe in a supreme eternal God, but in Karma and re-incarnation, rebirth, working to

escape suffering; all based on what they can do rather than what God can do. They view Jesus as a good teacher with a good message, but would not know that He has power to change and forgive them.”

“We did not fully know all about their customs,” he continued. “We just took our time as a whole family to get to know our neighbors, listened and learned as we went along, met people in the market, held English classes and camps, and invited the interested to church. The same way Jesus mingled is the way we lived because reaching them is about sharing love and caring for people.”

## ALL of Me in Response to ALL of God<sup>1</sup>

In today's fast-paced world, people are always looking for MORE – bigger houses with more bedrooms, faster downloading speeds, more horsepower, taller buildings, more gigabytes, HD, 3D, non-GMO's, iThis and iThat. Then before we know it, we find ourselves drained, overwhelmed and over budget yet still yearning for more hours in the day to “get ahead”. Depression is now surpassing Asthma as one of the top disability problems in Canada and the US<sup>2</sup>. Are we *really* doing the best we can with what God has blessed us with?

“Stewardship is a personal commitment to return to God what is His – not just financially, but with our time, talents and taking care of our environment,” as per Darlene Rey,

Stewardship Department Leader. This year, with God's guidance, the Stewardship Team plans to:

- Encourage each other to put our full and complete trust in God in everything we do
- Distribute *Stewpot*, an informative, monthly Stewardship newsletter
- Educate and inform on various Stewardship topics such as “*What is Systematic Giving?*” and “*Going Green*”
- Share testimonies of God's faithfulness in our lives

### 7 Principles toward Financial Faithfulness<sup>3</sup>:

With a foundation of basic biblical principles, you can grow in your financial stewardship and faithfulness as you:

**1. Recognize God as the Owner of everything** (Ps 24:1; Ps 50:12; 1Chr 29: 13, 14) Basic to all biblical money management is the recognition of God's ownership. We bring nothing into the world and we take nothing out. We simply manage what God has entrusted to us as a demonstration of our love and faithfulness to Him. (See also 1Ti 6:7; Mt 25:14; 1 Cor 4:1, 2)

**2. Understand that the wisdom of God brings blessings** (Pr 3: 5-10; Dt 28: 1-14) God sees the big picture—from beginning to end. With His wisdom and counsel, we can manage within His will and find blessings. Relying only

on our own management skills leads to loss and disappointment. (See Mt 6: 19-21, 33; Pr 14:12)

**3. Remember that our purpose in life is to glorify God**

(1 Cor 10:31; Mt 5:16) From the world's perspective, acquiring possessions is a life-long passion. God tells us that the world will be destroyed with the very elements burning up (2P 3:11, 12). Knowing this, if we are wise we will store up our treasures in heaven and live to glorify God.

**4. Understand that prosperity is having what you need when you need it**

(Php 4:19; Mt 28:20; Is 26:3) The world defines prosperity as the accumulation of things: big house, fancy car, expensive clothes, et cetera. God has *not* promised the world's standard of wealth as we follow Him. For us all, there is work to do to help others and to continue on in the cause of God and He has promised to provide for our every need, keeping us in perfect peace.

**5. Understand that debt is bad!**

(Pr 22:7; Rm 13:8; Dt 28:15-68; Ps 37:21) Many places in the world today experience slavery and bondage. And many people have become slaves to debt. It is important for us to live within our means so that we can maintain God's mission of love and share with others in need.

**6. Recognize tithe as the minimum testimony of Christian commitment**

(Gn 14:20; Gn 28:20-22; Mal 3:6-10; Lv 27:30) Regarding tithe, God does not appeal to our gratitude or our generosity. Returning our tithe is a matter of simple honesty. The tithe is to the modern Christian what the tree of knowledge of good and evil was to Adam and Eve—a test of our faithfulness and trust in God (See Counsels on Stewardship, p. 75). God doesn't need the money. We need the blessing!

**7. We must all give an account of our stewardship to God**

(Mt 25:19; 2 Cor 5:10; Rv 22:12) The way we have used what God has entrusted to us is one of the best indicators of our true heart condition. Someday we will stand before God in judgment.

Let's live our lives with these principles in mind.💡

# | FAITH | AV NOW HEAR THIS!

**P**icture this in your mind. You are at Mt. Zion church listening to a wonderful singer praise God with her song. Then the microphone suddenly turns off. There is no sound and you can barely hear a thing! What do you do? You do what any Mt. Zion member would do in this moment – turn your head around and look at the people in the AudioVisual (AV) Room. How about another scenario? A great speaker is delivering a very inspiring sermon and you strain to hear every word coming from him. Suddenly there is a high-pitched howling sound. Again, your head swivels around and you frown. In your mind you are saying, “Hey, what’s going on? Can you people in the AudioVisual room remain awake? Stop fooling around and do your job!”

Every Sabbath, we thank and appreciate the preachers, the singers, and the participants for rendering their messages. But we forget the medium through which those messages have reached our senses. Probably one of the most unappreciated, yet vitally important element of our worship experience is the AudioVisual Ministry. This group is unheralded, taken for granted, and usually blamed for errors not entirely their doing.

As we began the new year, the new AV team is challenged. But they are upbeat and three months into the year, they are already proving to be up to the task. The new AV leader is Dennis Rey, a “tech head” (technological expert) when

it comes to communication mediums. He has plans to improve the ministry, get rid of problematic issues, and usher the church into a new era of high tech worship experiences. In an interview with Beacon Light (BL), he talked about his plans for the team.

**BL ::** *How long have you been connected with the AudioVisual (AV) Ministry?*

**DR ::** I have been a member of this Ministry for three years. This is the first year I am heading it.

**BL ::** *Were you doing this kind of work before?*

**DR ::** Not professionally. Back in the Philippines I had a shop that repaired all kinds of communication equipment including sound systems, speakers, microphones, etc.

**BL ::** *How do you view the role or function of the AV team in the worship experience of the churchgoer? Do you think this role is important?*

**DR ::** I think the AV team plays a very important role when it comes to the worship experience. The speaker or singer delivers a message from God to the congregation. The message is from God but they are the medium. The worshipper receives this message through the senses. That’s where the AV comes in. This team plays a part in delivering the message, whether it be received clearly, garbled, partly, or not at all. Our responsibility is to make sure that the message is clearly received by those present.

**BL ::** *What kind of year is ahead for the AV team and what changes, if any, do you foresee?*

**DR ::** There will be changes. We will try to acquire new and better equipment that will suit our needs. We will reconfigure the physical setup of our existing equipment and see what works better and what doesn’t. We are getting a new mixer that will smoothly transition between audio and video. We will also be hiring professionals to train our personnel.

**BL ::** *Over the years, there have been several issues that continue to be of concern, and have been brought to your attention. What is your plan of resolution?*

**DR ::** Concern about the excessive talking and noise coming from the booth has been an issue. It’s a small workspace with a lot of equipment and it’s been challenging to maneuver in there. But with the new equipment and professional training, We plan to lessen the number of people needed in the room. The presence of personnel during Midweek and Vesper meetings to man the audio system and handle floor mics is another area that will be addressed by the training. We hope to acquire some headsets to enhance communication between the techs both in the booth and on the floor. And with a recent donation made to help purchase the new projector and screen, we look forward to making the over-all appearance of the stage more visually appealing and clean.

It’s high time our appreciation is shown. By affirming genuine service, we are truly building up God’s church. The next time you see an AV tech, you might want to say, “Thanks for what you do. Keep up the good work!”💡
